MPE CF & EG is an Erasmus+ KA2 Strategic Partnership in the field of Youth between NGOs from the UK, the Netherlands, Germany, Latvia and Turkey.

The project responds to needs of young people and youth organisations working with non-formal education in the youth sector. Project objectives:

- Developing a Peace Education Competence Framework including knowledge, skills and attitudes and requiring evaluation indicators, assessment methods as well as educational guidelines for achieving the competences
- Increasing the recognition of peace education by linking the Framework with the Youthpass and Europass certification system
- Increasing the quality of peace education activities in the youth sector
